



Playing with dad is fun

Did you know that dad's and mom's brains are different? Dads who think systematically and moms who have strong empathy interact differently with their children and provide them with different play experiences. Child who interact well with their dads from an early age are positively influenced by their expanded thinking and social development. Furthermore, as children grow, communication with their dads can be smoother, increasing parental satisfactions. Please refer to the information below and help your child grow together.

Co-parenting tips for dads!

- Have you ever been responsible for your child's 24-hour life? Take time to observe your child as he or she eats, sleeps, washes, and plays with you. You'll learn what your child likes.
- A father's unique parenting style is never inadequate. Often, a father's unique strengths as a man can be beneficial to our children's growth.
- Dad's are confident in physical play. However, if you blindly engage in repetitive physical play, they can quickly become exhausted and lose the ability to continue. Instead of leading excessive physical play from the beginning, try following your child's lead and playing alongside them.

Helping your child grow in play

sometimes supporting from behind

- When your child is absorbed in his or her play**
- Nod while watching your child play
 - Encourage them by verbally explaining the play scene.

sometimes leading from the front

- When you hesitate while looking at a game you want to play or challenge**
- Suggest play to your child first, and let them play. Explain or model.
 - Find out what you can't do, help you, and guide you to try.

sometimes together alongside

- When your child asks to play with you**
- Have fun playing for a short time

Emotional camping trip with dad

Camping is a great opportunity to show off your dad skills! There are moments when a father's help is needed, like pitching a tent, building a campfire, or preparing food. Camping, where you collaborate with your children outside of the home, can foster strong bond.

TIP How about trying this?

- **Have fun at the campsite!** Even if you don't plan anything, the campground is a playground with endless fun. You can observe nature, run, blow and catch bubbles, or just lie down and relax.
- **Take time to prepare together as father and son.** Your child will be more happy and satisfied if you help him wash vegetables for cooking or prepare for bed with him.
- **Try something different.** Before going to camping, prepare a long rope in advance. Prepare ropes at various heights and directions near trees or poles. Attached the ropes to the trees or poles at various heights and directions. Enjoy the game of jumping over the tangled ropes. You can develop flexibility and coordination by moving your body this way and that and tensely avoiding touching the ropes.
- **After you finish camping, organize the photos and videos you took.** You can reminisce about that day and create another story, or plan your next camping trip.
